### Principals Message

### **Curriculum Day**

Belvoir will be holding a Curriculum Day for all staff on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> of February. This is our second Curriculum day for the year and these days are very important for all staff and their professional development.

On the day staff will be learning how to keep all of us safe when we are confronted by students who display aggressive behaviour. Rod Catterall and two associates will be working with the whole staff for the day. We understand that these days can be very disruptive for families and we do apologise for this. There are a further two curriculum days allocated for the year. These will be held on the last day of term 3 and the last day of term 4.

Student Support Group (SSG) Meetings All staff will be contacting parents over the next couple of weeks to arrange for a formal student support group meeting. These meetings are a requirement for all of our students and need to occur at least twice per year. Parents are asked to bring along any ideas that they have for their child's learning program and to consider priorities that they have for their student both in the short and long term. It is a regional requirement that all SSG minutes are signed by families as a record of the meeting. Some staff will have parents do this at the SSG while others will send them home to be signed. These minutes will be used to develop each students Individual Learning Plan (ILP) and a copy of this will be sent home for all parents to keep and monitor across the course of first semester.

### **Parental Payments**

School Council has set the fees for 2019 at \$250 per student. This money goes towards paying for all the weekly excursions and outings that all students go on. This includes the cost of transport and all entry costs for the outings. This fee applies to all students at the school. The school owns our own buses and the cost of running these vehicles is heavily subsidized by school council. Other schools in the local area charge \$10 or more for excursions that take place during the year. As each of our classes have weekly outings this could amount to \$400 or more depending upon destination. We do acknowledge that some parents may have difficulty paying this fee; therefore, those who are eligible for the CSEF payment will have this amount credited towards their fees.

The only other cost that will be asked of parents will be the cost of the camp for Green, Purple and Orange PODs. All of these camps will take place in the second half of the year and costs associated with these camps will be sent home to all parents before the end of the term.


# **Buy a Paving Brick**



Dear Parent/Carer,

Belvoir's Annual Swimming Carnival will be held on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March 2019 at the Albury Swim Centre. On the day students will need to wear swimmers, sun smart hats, sunscreen and bring plenty of water. Students will be bussed to and from the carnival, leaving the school at approximately 9:30am and returning by 2:30pm. Classes will not be operating, as all staff will be at the carnival.

If you wish to transport your child you will need to let your child's teacher know and ensure they are at the pool by no later than 10:00am and be picked up by 2:00pm

A free sausage sizzle will be provided to all students for lunch and the pool canteen will be open throughout the day to purchase snacks. The pool will also open their slide to students throughout the day and again with your written permission your child can use this facility.

Please note that department of policy requires students with epilepsy to have an up to date Epilepsy Management Plan for swimming/water sports signed by a treating doctor before being allowed to swim/use the slide, which must not be more than 12 months old and be received by the school prior to the day.

Parents/carers of prep students must attend on the day to assist with the supervision of their child.

# Helping your Child to read

Reading together is a valuable thing to do. Reading increases the vocabulary of children, as well as expanding their understanding of the world, and gives them confidence when using language. Reading is also an important way to make the link between spoken words and written words.

# Some general tips:

Set aside time for reading every day. Reading before bedtime is a good habit to get



Look for rhyme, rhythm or repetition in books. This will help develop your



child's love of language.

Allow your child to read at their own pace. Model good pace when you read to them.

#### **CSEF ELIGIBILITY**

Below is the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

#### Criteria 1 - Eligibility

To be eligible\* for the fund, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one, or;
- on the first day of Term two;

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- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the *State Concessions Act 2004*, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date.

\* A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

#### Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and 17 years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and 18 years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

#### **Eligibility Date**

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2019) or term two (23 April 2019).

#### **PAYMENT AMOUNTS**

#### CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents so please register your interest at the school.

#### HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

#### NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

1. Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.

2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.

3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2019 closes on 28 June, 2019.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.

• information regarding my eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund may be disclosed to the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services and /or State Schools Relief for the purpose of evaluating concession card services or confirming eligibility for assistance.
