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School Fees

A reminder to all families that student school fees are currently due. These fees have been left at \$250 for a number of years and cover the cost of all outings carried out across the course of the year. Other schools in the local area charge \$10 or more for excursions that take place during the year. As each of our classes have weekly outings this could amount to \$400 or more depending upon destination. We do acknowledge that some parents may have difficulty paying this fee; therefore, those who are eligible for the CSEF payment will have this amount credited towards their fees. The only other cost that parents will incur through the year are incidental costs for lunches or fundraising for various causes and the cost of camps.

A reminder regarding your fees will be sent home to all families that are still to pay their fees.

If you have any questions regarding the school fees, please feel free to give me a call.

Absences

All parents are reminded about the importance of having their child at school as often as possible. Whilst we do understand that many of our students have serious medical issues that don't allow them to come to school every day, we want to maximize attendance as far as possible.

All unexplained absences will cause an email to be sent to parents. After two days if you have not contacted the school to explain your child's absence you will get a call from the office to explain the absence. We are wanting to work with parents to ensure students are at school as often as possible and are happy to talk with you if you are having a particular problem.

As a last resort Belvoir is required to report all students with extended absences to the Department of Education if the attendance issue cannot be resolved. This may assist, but can also make it more difficult for parents and students alike.






Room 13 News!


