#### Coronavirus

There has been a lot of information in the media regarding the Coronavirus. As a school who has a number of students who have a reduced or compromised immunity we are particularly aware of the risks that an outbreak of the virus would cause many of our students.

At this point in time there are no staff, students or family members at the school who have a confirmed case of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) or are a close contact of a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days. 'Close contact' is defined by DHHS as someone who has had at least 15 minutes of face-to-face contact with a confirmed case, or shared a closed space with someone for more than two hours with a confirmed case.

Should either of these points occur Belvoir is required to contact DHHS and the Department of Education. They will then inform the school as to the actions that will need to be undertaken to ensure all staff and students are as safe as possible. Good hygiene practices are the most effective means of minimising the spread of COVID-19, and our school will continue to encourage these practices.

Unless we have a student/family member or staff member in one of the two above categories, we do not need to take further action. However as a school we will be increasing the cross infection cleaning routines that all classrooms undertake and will be continuing to promote the positive hygiene messages across the school.

#### **How Can Parents Help**

Please notify us immediately if you or your child falls into one of the two categories listed above.

Encourage good personal hygiene practices at home.

Keep your child at home if they are unwell, especially if they are showing signs or symptoms of a respiratory infection.

Everyone can protect against infections by practising good hand and respiratory hygiene.

Here are some tips that we all can follow:

- 1. Cover your mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing with a tissue, or cough into your elbow.
- 2. Dispose of the tissue into a bin and then wash your hands afterwards.
- 3. Wash your hands regularly using soap and water, including after using the toilet, and before eating. Please refer to the Department's coronavirus web page for the latest advice and information. - Jamie Gay


