Reminder to Keep Children Home if They Have Cold/Flu Symptoms

As per Department of Education expectations, children and staff experiencing cold/flu symptoms need to stay home. If your child displays any of the following symptoms whilst at school, they will be assessed by First Aid staff and <u>they may be sent home</u>:

fever

shortness of breath

flu-like symptoms such as coughing, sore throat or runny nose

Part of the assessment will involve checking your child's temperature with a digital thermometer – **if you do not wish for your child's temperature to be checked, please contact the school.**

If your child displays any of these symptoms as a result of an <u>ongoing medical condition</u>, please provide a letter from your doctor so we can take this into account.

Outings This Term

We can begin outings from week 4 with students again this term (as long as we don't go into NSW and we stay within 50 kms of Wodonga). You child's teacher will inform you closer to the time if there is an outing approved for their class.

Headlice and Gastro

There have been some cases of head lice and gastro at school this week and letters containing information were sent home last week. Please note that if your child has headlice, they must not return to school until they have had treatment. If your child has gastro, they must not return to school within 24 hours. Your support with this will help ensure other children do not catch head lice or gastro.



We have also been searching for TREASURE when we are reading. Treasure is when we find things that are exciting to us as a reader in the text.


Adjectives are the fancy name for descriptive words.

In WRS we are planning a BBQ it will be done between Orange pod classes.



A-D = Red -Mitta E-K = Green -Murray L-Q = Blue -Kiewa R-Z = Yellow -Hume


