Temperature Checks

In order to support community awareness of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) and to help identify children displaying symptoms, all schools located areas with Stage 3 restrictions will commence temperature screening of students. This is an important public health measure to promote awareness of symptoms associated with coronavirus (COVID-19) and to ensure that unwell students remain at home.

For Belvoir this means as of Monday we will begin checking the temperature with a digital thermometer of all children as they arrive at school. We understand this may create some angst for our children, so could families please discuss this over the weekend to help them understand what we will be doing.

Face Masks

Students who are enrolled in a specialist school are not required to wear a face covering inside or outside school but may do so if they or their family choose to.

Teachers, educators and carers are not required to wear face coverings while teaching or caring for children as face coverings can interfere with their ability to clearly communicate with students or children in their care.

Students have been provided with a student identity card to prove that they are enrolled at Belvoir Special School – if your child has lost their card, please contact the front office.

No Self-Isolation Required After Visit to Melbourne

A few families have asked about any rules for self-isolation for Victorian residents following visits to Melbourne. I have confirmed with the Department that there is no requirement to self-isolate after returning from Melbourne, unless there are symptoms present and/or waiting for the results of a COVID test. Only NSW residents are required to self-isolate.

Reminder to Keep Children Home if They Have Cold/Flu Symptoms

As per Department of Education expectations, children and staff experiencing cold/flu symptoms need to stay home. If your child displays any of the following symptoms whilst at school, they will be assessed by First Aid staff and they may be sent home:

fever

shortness of breath flu-like symptoms such as coughing,

sore throat or runny nose.

If your child displays any of these symptoms as a result of an ongoing medical condition, please provide a letter from your doctor so we can take this into account.





We have been working on our reading stamina since returning to school and the students are improving every day. We have set a World Record of 20 minutes. This allows the teachers to meet with students frequently to listen to their reading and set individual reading goals with them so they can continue to improve.



In Writing, the students have been using a range of tools to support them for generating ideas and helping with writing their words. Ethan is using a Silly Sentence board to help him create a short story. Max is using an alphabet flipchart to help him select the sounds in words. Kyle has written a letter to Will in Room 4. He used a combination of the alphabet flipchart and the classroom word wall to help him write his message.



The students have been learning about how they have changed over time. They explored what they looked like as a baby and comparing it to themselves today. Their Venn diagrams show how they have changed.



Room 5 have been working very hard on their reading, writing since the last time we shared our learning with you all. Also, students have been using Seesaw to post their learning to their family and carers and learning about how they have changed over time as part of their unit of work. The students really enjoy seeing the 'likes' and 'comments' parents and carers make on their work.

Students have also commenced the Learn to Play program. The students are learning how to develop their Pretend Play skills through set activities and with the support of the teachers. They are doing a fantastic job!

Erica




Students, Staff and Parents are put into groups according to their surnames. Each group has a name and colour and its requested that everyone wears clothing the colour of the house they are allocated to.
